2017 VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL

“Maker Fun Factory VBS-Created by God Built for a Purpose” was held from Sunday July 23 through Thursday July 27 – 6pm to 8:15pm. The program was offered to children K through Adults with a Bible Class led by Vic Brinton for anyone over High School age.

The VBS program was advertised free of charge by Press Releases published in the Chronicle and Advertiser Newspapers. Posters were also posted at Kreiders Market, Jims Bait Shop at Octorara Lake, Meadowbrook Farm Market, Oma's Campground, JP Auto, Findley Motorcycle Shop, Bartville Store and Caruso's Pizza Restaurant. An announcement with information was also given to the Bart-Colerain Elementary Released Time Students on their last day of that class. An announcement was also posted at Maplehofes Dairy Store and the produce stand along Rt. 222, below Center Rd.

There was a small, committed group of volunteers who met and prayed seeking God's blessing from the beginning of the planning process. It was agreed we would gather for prayer before each evening program.

This VBS program cost under \$300 for Music, Lesson Instructions, and Crafts, with some additional donated administrative supplies, and a very generous donation of snacks to be offered for up to 48 children. My unofficial record was the VBS offering totaled \$104.

Unfortunately, we were unable to practice prior to VBS with all volunteers present with sound tech, but the first evening of VBS brought not one child, so it was a good "dress rehearsal" for the rest of the week.

Those who were prepared to work with the elementary children listened to the lesson and went along with the program with the 3 Teens who attended Day 1. The Holy Spirit was evident in the joy and commitment to share in that time together. Three teens also attended Day 2 in the same spirit. Day 3 finally brought 5 elementary age children who were invited by the only elementary child we had attending Colerain Baptist Church at that time. Since we had no game leader, all ages played kickball for game time and that was truly a big hit with the kids. Day 4 had 4 elementary children and 4 teens, and Day 5 had 3 elementary children and teens had moved on to their own group for VBS.

The children crafted a good number of artificial flowers to be given to shut-ins.

Total of five children actually attended the VBS, and an average of 4-6 Adults and teens each night.

In hindsight, it is evident that outreach efforts from this small church congregation require all generations to work together. There was a blessing in that spirit, as we have seen faithful attendance from one teen and one young man since VBS. The committed, serving hearts of all those involved gave glory to God.

It is also obvious that guests come from being personally invited. It was the one young family with a child who brought their friends to VBS and one teen who was inviting other teens. Also noted, there was some distraction prior to the start of VBS the first couple nights. I would not recommend attempting another outreach like VBS unless you have enough participants within the congregation to start with.
